It is our painful duty to record yet another death in our midst. On this occasion it is not one of the "old identities" who have crossed the barrier, but a respected young man in the person of Mr Phil Corner (a son of the late Mr Alfred Corner) who resided at Rushworth and who was but thirty years of age.

It appears that a little over a week ago, deceased assisted to lever a traction engine, and, on completion of the work late in the evening he got into his gig and drove away without putting on his coat. He caught a cold, and pneumonia and dropsy supervened, and he passed away from these causes on Tuesday night after but a week's illness.

About 18 months ago deceased was married and he leaves a young wife and a child of three months to mourn their great loss, and for them is felt the deepest sympathy.

The remains of deceased were interred in the local cemetery yesterday afternoon, a large number of people following the remains to the grave, where the funeral obsequies were carried out by Mr Raff.
