Another old resident of Rushworth, in the person of Mr. Robert Hall, passed to his long rest in Melbourne on Friday last, 9th February, after a short illness at the age of 77.

He is survived by a brother, Mr. Geo. Hall, of Tatura. He had been an invalid for some time and of late had led a secluded life owing to his indisposition.

In his younger days he was employed as a forest worker in Moorabool State forest and later engaged in mining operations with varying degrees of success.

The funeral was conducted at Rushworth cemetery on Saturday last, the Rev. Father E. Tehan performing the last rites of the church.
