The death occurred at Kew on Saturday last of a former resident of Rushworth district in the person of Mr. William Chamberlain, who was born at Redcastle 74 years ago, and resided with his parents at Gobarup for many years.

After his marriage to Miss Love, of Heathcote, he moved to Redcastle, later coming to Rushworth.

Deceased was a lifelong sufferer from epilepsy and increasing ill-health caused his removal to Kew.

He will be remembered as a kind-hearted and pleasant man, and in his younger days was a fearless horseman. He could tell of many stirring incidents in the early days.

His wife predeceased him three years ago.

The remains were conveyed to Rushworth for burial, the Rev W. A. Williams performing the last rites.

The coffin bearers were his nephews, Messrs A. Mitchell, F. Clark, C. Clark and F. Eickert.
