Much regret was expressed in the town when it was learned that Mr. W. Davies, a well-known resident of Rushworth, had passed away at the Mooroopna Hospital of Monday, 17th inst., where he had been taken the day previously.

The late Mr. Davies, who was 53 years of age, has been a resident of the town for about eight years, and was the proprietor of the Wine Café in Moora street.

He was of a very generous nature and gave freely to all local movements, and was a good supporter of the Rushworth football Club, being at one time a member of the committee.

His sudden death is greatly regretted by a large circle of friends and he will be much missed as a good townsman.

His mother and two sisters (who are residents of Sydney) survive him.

The funeral place on Tuesday, the remains having been brought to Rushworth for interment in the local cemetery.

The funeral was largely attended and wreaths were sent by Mrs. Davies, senr., and deceased's sister, also by the Rushworth Football Club and Messrs. R. A. C. Smith (who acted for the relatives), H. Lynch and L. Spence.

The funeral service was conducted by the Rev. F. G. Faram.
