Mr William Hughes, who has been known in connection with this and the North-Eastern districts since 1853, and who has for the last four years or so carried on business at Rushworth as a butcher, expired at his residence, High Street, on Wednesday morning last, from congestion of the lungs.

Deceased, who was of a genial temperament and unobtrusive manner, was much liked and leaves, we understand, two sons, one practising as an engineer near Beechworth, and the other articled to a barrister in Melbourne.

The remains, which were followed by a large number of people, were interred in the Rushworth Cemetery yesterday.

Respected he may have been, but buried one day and his goods sold up two days later!
